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## What is the Link?

The Link is a network of local, state and federal partners working together to help persons age 60 and over adults and persons with disabilities obtain the services and supports they need to remain as independent as possible in a setting of their choice.

This effort is overseen by the Pennsylvania Department of Aging.

## Do I need to be of a certain age or income level to receive assistance from the Link?

Link partners help *adults of all ages and income levels* find services and supports essential to living happy, healthy, purposeful lives. There is no cost for information or assistance provided by the Link, however, certain provider agencies may have a fee for their services.

## What can the Link help me do?

- Locate affordable and accessible housing options
- Complete an application for public benefits
- Obtain transportation
- Find information on Veterans benefits and services
- Navigate the maze of health insurance, including Medicare
- Find employment and training programs
- Obtain home modifications or assistive technology
- Coordinate in-home services for yourself or a loved one
- Connect with legal aid
- Move out of a nursing facility
- Find food pantries or other meal options
- Locate support groups

- Obtain information on managing chronic diseases
- Review your social security benefits
- Locate Mental Health or Drug & Alcohol services
- Find options for adult day services or respite services
- Apply for assistance with utility bills (i.e. LIHEAP)
- Connect to Hospice services
- Plan ahead for future health care costs and needs
- Learn how to communicate with family members about your end-of-life wishes
- Pre-arrange a funeral
