

A "Certificate of Attendance" will be provided at no cost to attendees at the close of the program. Note that this "Certificate of Attendance" is not accepted by professional boards.


Location

From Harrisburg: Rt. 283 East to Esbenshade Rd. Exit. Turn right onto Esbenshade and continue through light. Bear left onto Old Harrisburg Pike. Entrance immediately on left.
