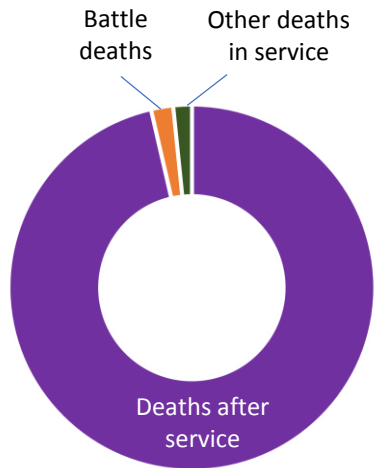


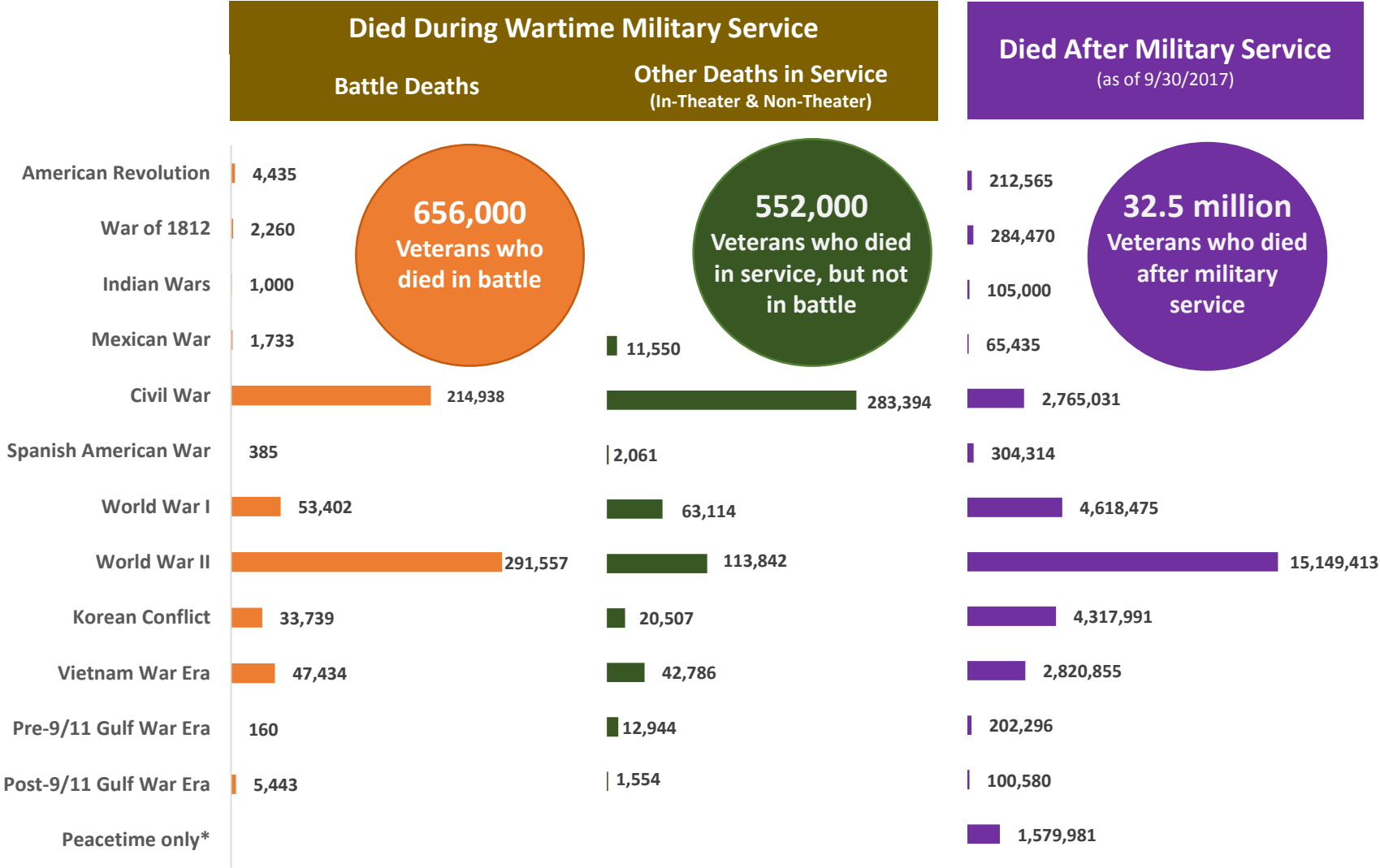


On Memorial Day VA Honors All Who Have Served and Died

The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs honors the service and sacrifice of America’s Veterans this Memorial Day. This infographic shows the number who have died in service to our nation or after their time in the military. VA honors their service with benefits provided by the National Cemetery Administration (NCA).

Notes: Memorial Benefits includes Interments, Headstones, Grave Markers, and Medallions. In FY 2018, NCA provided 135,306 interments and 364,698 Headstones, Markers, and Medallions. Peacetime Veterans are those who served between 1918-1941, 1947-1950, 1955-1964, or 1975-1990. Death information for this population is limited to only those who used a VA benefit or served after 1975. Post-9/11 Gulf War Era Wartime deaths are as of May 13, 2019.
